Trainwreck Productions is striving to be a bold statement in theatre with both the material we perform and the way we perform it.

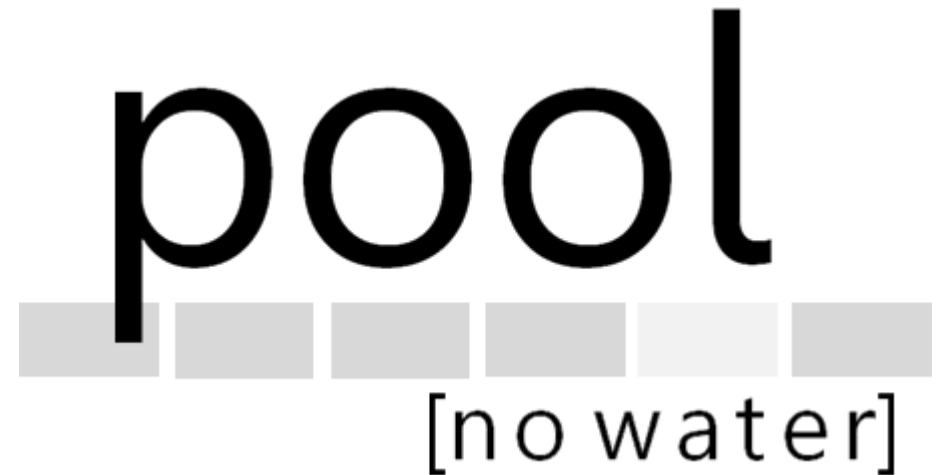

It is often said that the arts are the first industry to suffer during economic hardship and the first people will flock to when it subsides.
